Mexico's Distribution Center & Warehouse: A CHANGE IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION

Changes are everywhere, and Mexico's warehouse is not an exception. Kumon Mexico is continuously improving. Early this year, they moved their distribution center and warehouse to a bigger location. They are looking forward to providing better service to our Instructors, as well as to providing better working conditions to staff members while keeping the environment in mind. In less than a decade, Kumon Mexico increased from one subject to three, making a bigger and more complex operation. Therefore, the number of staff also grew.

The new location is in an easily accessible location now, and that is motivating staff to arrive via bicycle. This is encouraging people to lower their carbon footprint and save on gas. We already have four people using their bicycle to commute to work. This new warehouse offers a bigger, safer and more suitable workspace. Also, this new building offers natural light most days, which is reducing the electric energy usage. We installed LED and sensor lighting throughout the new space.

In addition, the new space allows for plants, and they contribute to a better and more oxygenated work environment. The new workspace is bigger, cleaning is easier, it has an open floorplan, and management has the freedom to modify the layout as needed.

Another area of improvement is the new building's recycling storage. The distribution center now offers a more efficient way to store recycled cardboard and paper, which allows for a faster recycling process. Also, new packaging processes help the worksheets remain in a better condition for a longer time, so this will increase quality control. The building materials, such as metal flooring, used in this new building provide an eco-friendly approach and are a big improvement. We have improved water usage in restrooms by utilizing a waterless urinal in the men's room.

Kumon Mexico is constantly thinking of ways to improve our impact on the environment, and moving to this new distribution center was a big step in the right direction.
