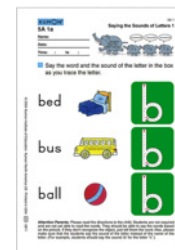


Kumon Reading Level 5A

Students develop more pre-reading skills by saying individual sounds while tracing letters. Toward the end of the level, students begin to put together simple three-letter words.

When completing the Kumon worksheets at home, please follow these steps:



Do's	Don'ts
Let your child write their name, date, start time and end time on the 1st page only.	Ask your child to read words without pictures on page 5b, 10b, 1b5, 20b, 25b, 30b, 35b, 40b, 50b, 55b, 60b, 65b, 70b, 75b, 80b, 85b, 90b, 95b, 100b, 105b, 110b.
Read the directions aloud to your child.	Force your child to blend the letters together to read the words.
Always read "Attention Parents" Notes on the 1st page of every set.	Cover the picture and ask your child to guess or read the words.
Begin immediately after writing the start time.	Use the worksheets to teach another language.
Make sure your child traces the letters neatly, within the borders and in the correct stroke order.	Encourage your child to complete the worksheet without saying the words and the sound of letters.
Always have your child say the words aloud and say the sound of each letter as he or she traces the letter.	
Always have your child say sentences aloud.	
Praise your child after he/she reads the words or sentences aloud.	
If your child stumbles over some words, use the pictures as prompts or model read.	
If your child doesn't recognize the picture, just tell them the word.	
Praise your child if he/she is able to remember the word on the following page.	
Praise your child when he/she has completed all the worksheets.	

*Attention Parents Notes: The notes on the "a" side of page 1, 11, 21, 31, 41, 51, 61, 71, 81, 91, 101, 111, 121, 131, 141, 151, 161 contain information about the goal of each worksheet set and instructions to help your child say the letters and words using picture cues.

Other tips to supplement Kumon at Home:

- Ask your Instructor for Kumon's Recommended Reading List and Read Aloud List!
Ask for books that your child can practice on his or her own with your help.
- Read aloud your child with animation and expression.
- Read their favorite books over and over.
