

## Kumon Reading Level 2A

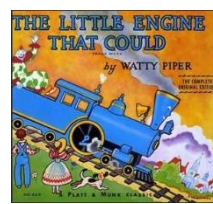
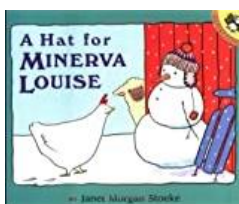
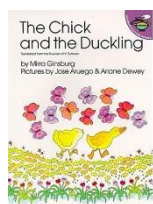
Students prepare for the Sentence Building Block (Levels AI-CII) through the development of independent reading, writing, and spelling skills. Students learn how parts of speech function in a sentence by identifying nouns, verbs, and adjectives.

*When completing the Kumon worksheets at home, please follow these steps:*

Do's	Don't s
Let your child write their name, date, start time and end time on the 1st page only.	Print all letters with the same size.
Read the instructions aloud to your child.	Forget to write name, date, and time on each day's homework as this is now the student's first expectation for each day's Kumon homework routine.
Begin immediately after writing the start time.	Force your child to sound out the spelling on the b-side if they're not ready. They can refer to the a-side for spelling.
Guide your child to print neatly with proper letter sizes on the given dotted lines on the worksheets.	Watch TV or have other distractions while doing your work.
Emphasize on the sizing of letters – “attic letters” such as b, d, f, h, k, l, t should be tall, “basement letters” such as g, j, p, q, y should go below the solid blank lines when writing on the worksheets	
Read all pages aloud after filling in the blanks on each worksheet.	
Read the instructions aloud on 2A 61a, 71a, 81a, 91a, 101a, 111a, 121a, 131a, 141a to learn the definitions of nouns, verbs, and adjectives.	
Refer back to the a-side of the worksheets to check for spelling.	
Praise your child when he/she has completed all the worksheets.	

Other tips to supplement Kumon at Home:

- You can ask your child to re-read yesterday's or today's booklet one more time independently, with encouragement and praise!
- Read aloud to your child with animation and expression
- Read their favourite books over and over
- You can find the books from the RRL (next page) at your local bookstore or from the public library.
